- Ms. Joke Swiebel, former Member of the European Parliament.

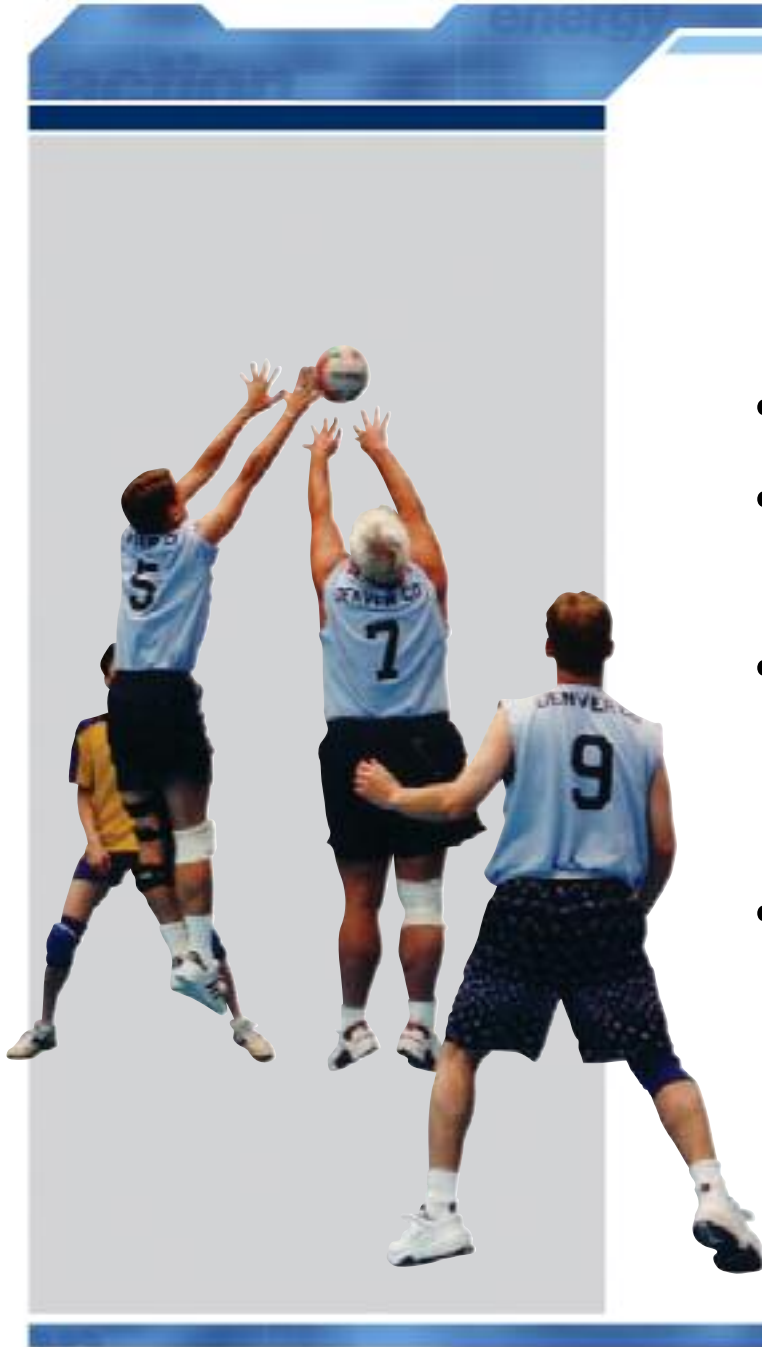
